EYFS Prime Areas	
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Become more outgoing towards familiar people- making friends, forming relationships with adults and peers.• Understand rules and why they're important.• Express feelings and understand the feelings of others.• Learn the differences between healthy and unhealthy, and why healthy eating is important.
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Working on fine motor skills such as using pencils and scissors• Practising pencil grip.• Taking part in group activities such as running, skipping, jumping and hopping.• Using large muscle movement (gross motor skills) such as waving flags, streamers, paint and mark make.

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Read Write Inc (Phonics)

The Phonics program we use in school is called Read Write Inc. This program teaches children all 44 sounds of the English alphabet, how to form the letters correctly and how to blend the sounds together to help them read words.

During our first term, we will be focusing on learning all of the single letter sounds, as well as practising how to form them correctly. Below are the sounds we will be teaching the children this term in the order as follows:

m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, j, v, y, w, z, q, x


When practising saying these sounds with your child, it is important to only say the sound and not the letter name.




